INTRODUCTION AND GUIDELINES FOR COMPETITORS

Parking – All Light Horses and working hunter competitors must park as directed by official parking attendants. To gain access to the show rings all competitors must use the horse walk ways provided.

Insufficient entries – The committee reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes if necessary.

Supreme Championship - To be judged once all classes are finished. The Champion from each section and will take part, provided that their section has finished in time, Exhibitors will be advised on the day where to gather and stewards will be available to escort them. A Supreme In-Hand and a Supreme Ridden Champion will be chosen.

ALL EQUINE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE NO EARRINGS, PIERCINGS OR VISIBLE JEWELLERY
WILL BE ALLOWED

NPS Classes This show is affiliated to the NPS – entrants do not need to be members of the NPS to compete. The following classes are affiliated to NPS 16-31 (M & M In Hand, Ridden), 32-38 (Show/Show Hunter Ponies), 40-48 (M & M WHP) NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members, but only ponies owned by adult Qualifying or Life NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition. The highest placed pony, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

RACEHORSE TO RIDING HORSE REQUIREMENTS

The ROR Tattersalls Scottish Thoroughbred Show Series 2018

The ROR Tattersalls Scottish Show Series Qualifier, thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over. Horses should be 14 ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or Simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show 2019. All entries MUST be registered with the ROR and have RACED in GB.

There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of ROR. Horses to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series.

Amateur Definition – An amateur is a person who for the purpose of ROR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses (for the show ring) in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard (in the current season or previous season). Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not have received any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current or previous season. Horses must not have been ridden at a show by a rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Class 1 - THE ROR TATTERSALLS SCOTTISH SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height. Riders must be aged 15 years or over. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. The first 3 go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show 2019. All entries must be registered with the ROR and have raced in GB. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of the ROR. Horse to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series.

Class 2 - ROR OPEN IN HAND SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER (FORMERLY TARRA)

Open to all ROR registered horses, 3 years and over, fillies, mares, and geldings. Horses that have raced abroad or been in training are also eligible. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. The first 3 horses will qualify. This class is a qualifier for the ROR OPEN In Hand Showing Series FINAL at the ROR National Championship Show at Aintree, August 2018.

Class 3 ROR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER (FORMERLY TARRA)

Open to all ROR and NR registered horses, 4 years and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an amateur. The series is open to AMATEURS only, those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'Riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. The first 3 horses will qualify. The judge will not ride at the qualifier but will ride in the final. This class is a qualifier for the ROR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series final at the ROR National Championship Show at Aintree, August 2018.

Dumfries and Galloway retraining of racehorse's championship will be judged at the end of this section. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be judged from the 1st & 2nd placed competitors from each class. Judging will commence immediately following the end of the final class. The Section Champion is eligible to compete in the Supreme Horse Championship.

Class 1 - ROR Rosettes 1st - 6th place, vouchers 1st to 4th place. Veteran prize, £25 voucher to be redeemed from ROR office and qualification for the Veteran final at Aintree. 1st £60 plus voucher for jacket, 2nd £40, 3rd £20, 4th £10.

Class 2 - ROR Rosettes 1st - 6th & Prizes 1st £30 plus ROR jacket, 2nd £20, 3rd £10, 4th £10

Class 3 - ROR Rosettes 1st - 6th & Prizes 1st £40 plus ROR jacket, 2nd £30, 3rd £20, 4th £10

ROR Championship - Open to all 1st and 2nd prize-winners classes 1 to 3.

Open to members and non-members. However, **only Members may go forward to the Championship of the day.**

VHS Scottish Supreme (Pre-Judging) Final qualification. ONLY MEMBERS placed 1st to 2nd in each age category will go to the Veteran Championship of the Day. In all classes - if competitors placed 1st or 2nd are not Members, qualification will be given to 3rd & 4th providing they are Members. Qualification will not go lower than 4th place. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Champions and Reserve Both In-hand and Ridden must have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. This will qualify through the pre-judging of the Supreme. Entry to the Pre-qualification Championships is to be made online via the VHS website. Stabling only to be booked directly with the venue. Ingliston Equestrian Centre.

Young Rider Championship qualification. A Young Rider rosette and qualification will be awarded to the young rider of the Judge's choice, entitling them to enter the Young Rider Championship Prior to the Supreme Final This award is given at the Judge's discretion. Non- Members to receive an orange card.

Combined and Specialist Classes

Champion and reserves from both In-hand and Ridden Championships will receive a Scottish Supreme Entry for Pre-judging the day before the Supreme Final at Ingliston Equestrian Centre.

Mountain & Moorland - The highest placed Mountain and Moorland in each class will receive entry to the pre-judging of the Mountain & Moorland Supreme Final at Ingliston. Providing they are Members. This may be carried down to 4th place

Class 8 **VHS RIDDEN NATIONAL VETERAN OPEN CLASS (15-30 years).** Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height. Open to professionals and amateurs. The final to be held at the **National Veteran Open Championship** 1st and 2nd qualify. Offered to Non-members however, any competitor qualifying for the Open Supreme must become a Member within 21 days of qualification.

No substitutions will be accepted. NO SPURS, GALLOPING, WEARING OF FACE/BODY JEWELLERY ARE PERMITTED. IN HAND CLASSES - MINIMUM AGE OF HANDLER 9 YEARS. STALLIONS - EITHER IN HAND OR RIDDEN COMPETITORS MUST BE OVER THE AGE OF 16 YEARS. GROOMS MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER. LEAD REIN COMPETITORS MUST HAVE A GROOM. THE LEADER MUST LEAD THE PONY IN THE STRIP SECTION AND THE RIDER MUST STAY WITH THE GROOM. COMPETITORS CANNOT ENTER THE RING ONCE THE COMMAND FOR TROT HAS BEEN GIVEN, THE SAME RIDER/HANDLER/PONY/HORSE COMBINATION MUST STAY THE SAME WHETHER SIDE SADDLE OF ASTRIDE FROM FIRST/SECOND OR DIRECT ROUTE QUALIFIERS AND GRAND FINAL. "This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No 18212. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 30th August-1st September 2018. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2019 qualifiers. The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers [Show Secretary to insert class numbers]. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete these classes. **All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK).**

All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

N.B.: Classes should NOT include Spotted, Roans or Palominos.

All Affiliated Shows will offer qualification under the following rulings only: CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW QUALIFIERS (see CHAPS Handbook) CHAPS (UK) Qualifying classes enable eligible exhibits to enter the relevant classes at the CHAPS (UK) Championship Show in the year relevant to the qualification. Separate Finals will be held at the Championship Show for Yearlings, Two Year Olds, Three Year Olds and for Natives and Non-Natives (Ridden and In Hand), together with Ridden Finals for Lead Read, First Ridden, Junior, Novice and Side Saddle sections.

Ring 2 - To follow Hunter classes **BSHA Classes (British Show Horse Association) Class 57 – 61**

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

DAY TICKETS

Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form or apply online on the BSHA website.

Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The three highest placed prize winners in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic Supreme classes at the National Championship Show September 2018.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

The Association will also award an Amateur Home-Produced rosette in all Affiliated Open Cob (Light & Heavyweights only) classes. These rosettes have been kindly sponsored by TSG, Mr L Turley. The awards will go down the line; there is no limit on how many of these rosettes can be claimed in a year.
